

**Anton ADĂMUȚ** is a professor at the Alexandru Ioan Cuza University from Iași, Department of Philosophy. Coordinates Ph.D. theses since 2002 (the fundamental domain of Ph.D.: *humanist sciences*; the domain of Ph.D.: *history of philosophy*). Won the Award of the Romanian Academy, category Philosophy (The Vasile Conta Award) in 1999, for the volume *The Philosophy of substance*. Is member of the Union of Writers in Romania. Books (selective): *Christian literature and philosophy* (1997); *Sketch for a subjective history of philosophy* (1999); *[And] the Philosophy of Camil Petrescu* (2007/2008); *How philosophers dream* (2008); *Philosophy and theology in Saint Augustine* (2009); *The Phenomenology of the other (the Case of Plato – Symposium)* (2011); *Amicus Plato sed magis amica veritas. The History of the saying from Homer to Tarski* (2018).

**Raluca Georgiana BABII** is a Ph.D. student at the Doctoral School of Philological Studies at the Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iași. Her doctoral research interests focus on *The sentimental novel in interwar Romanian literature*, which is also the title of her thesis.
